Viva Gesu'!

My dearest Sisters,

"Your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions" (Joel 2: 28)

We begin the new month of February with the celebration of the 23rd World Day of Consecrated Life on the 2nd. Forty days after Christmas, we celebrate the Lord who enters the Temple to encounter his people. In the Eastern countries, this feast is called the "Feast of Encounter": it is the encounter between God who became a child to bring newness to our world and expectant humanity represented by the elderly man and the woman. In the Temple, there is also an encounter between two couples: the young Mary and Joseph, and the elderly Simeon and Anna. The old receive from the young, while the young draw from the old. This event fulfils the prophecy of Joel: "Your old men shall dream dreams and your young men shall see visions" (Joel 2:28). In this encounter, the young see their mission and the elderly realize their dreams. In religious life, if the young are called to open new doors, the elderly have the keys. An institute remains youthful by going back to its roots, by listening to its older members. All these are possible because at the centre of the encounter, there is Jesus. Consecrated life is born and reborn of an encounter with Jesus as he is: poor, chaste and obedient. We are called to believe that the Sisters of our community are given to us by God, and they are a part of our history, gifts to be cherished. If we encounter Jesus and our brothers and sisters in the everyday events of our life, our hearts will no longer be set on the past or the future but will experience the "today of God" in peace with everyone. May the Lord give light to our eyes and strength to our steps to walk together toward Him with the road map of holiness as designed by our Holy Father: Holiness is Joy and a Sense of Humour, Boldness and Passion.

Pope Francis says that the saints are joyful and full of good humour. They radiate a positive and hopeful spirit. The Christian life is 'joy in the Holy Spirit' if we allow the Lord to draw us out of our masks and change our lives. Jesus assures us: 'You will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy'. Christian joy is accompanied by a sense of humour. We see this clearly in St. Thomas More, St. Vincent de Paul and St. Philip Neri. 'Ill humour is no sign of holiness', asserts, Pope Francis.

St. Paul rightly says that we receive much from the Lord 'for our enjoyment' and yet forget them easily. In fact, sadness can be a sign of ingratitude. We can get so caught up in ourselves that we are unable to recognize God's gifts. We must be able to say along with St.Thomas More, "Grant me, O Lord, a simple soul that knows to treasure all that is good; grant me a sense of good humour; give me the grace to be able to take a joke and to discover in life a bit of joy and to be able to share it with others".

With the love of a father, God tells us to treat ourselves well and not to deprive ourselves of a happy day (Cf. Sir 14:11.14). God wants us to be positive, grateful and uncomplicated, to be joyful in the day of prosperity; God created human beings straightforward, but they have devised many schemes (Cf. Eccl 7:14.29). Come what may, we should remain resilient and imitate St. Paul who says that he had learnt to be content with what he had. St. Francis of Assisi could be overwhelmed with gratitude before a piece of hard bread and joyfully praise God simply for the breeze that caressed his face. Dear Sisters, how wonderful our communities will be if we are grateful for all that we receive! We too can become saints if we learn to be grateful always!

The Roman Pontiff tells us that *fraternal love* increases our capacity for joy since it makes us capable of rejoicing in the good of others: "Rejoice with those who rejoice" (Rom12:15). "We are glad whenever we are weak but you are strong;" (2 Cor. 13:9). We need to realize that there is more happiness in giving than in receiving. In this way, we can combat the influence of an individualistic and consumerist culture that tempts us to focus primarily on our own needs and condemn ourselves to a **joyless existence** (Cf. GE122-128).

We note in almost all the letters of Mother Mazzarello a repeated question: 'Are you cheerful?' Just to mention a few: as she writes to Sr. Teresina the first question is: "Are you cheerful?" "I want you to be cheerful and keep all your Sisters cheerful too" (*L.41*). While writing to Sr. Vittoria Cantu', Mother Mazzarello says: "you tell me you are happy and I rejoice in that" (*L.42*). She tells the newly professed Sr. Laura Rodriguez, "never lose the cheerfulness which the Lord wants" (*L.43*). So dear Sisters, let us be cheerful always as we serve the Lord in His people.

Holiness is Boldness and Passion

Jesus himself comes and tells us once more serenely yet firmly: "Do not be afraid". These words enable us to go forth and serve with the same courage that the Holy Spirit stirred up in the Apostles, impelling them to proclaim Jesus Christ. Boldness, enthusiasm, the freedom to speak out, apostolic fervour: they all mean only one thing: *courage to proclaim the good news*. The Supreme Pontiff says that often we are tempted to keep close to the shore. Yet the *Lord calls us to put out into the deep and let down our nets* (cf. *Lk.* 5:4). He bids us spend our lives in his service. We see Jesus who with His deep compassion reached out to others. It did not make him hesitant, timid or self-conscious as it often happens with us. Boldness and apostolic courage are an essential part of our mission.

Holy Father warns us so that we may not be paralyzed by fear and excessive caution and not to grow used to keeping within safe bounds. Let us remember that closed spaces grow musty and unhealthy. Like the prophet Jonah, we are constantly tempted to flee to a safe haven. It can have many names: individualism, spiritualism, living in a little world, addiction, stubbornness, rejection of new ideas and approaches, rigidity, nostalgia, pessimism, and hiding behind rules and regulations. Let us listen to the God of tenderness who invites us to set out ever anew on our journey; to pass beyond what is familiar and go to the fringes and beyond. He takes us to where humanity is most wounded. Jesus is already there in the hearts of our brothers and sisters, in their wounded flesh, in their troubles and in their profound

desolation. Let us ask the Lord for the grace not to hesitate when the Spirit calls us to take a step forward. Let us welcome the Lord's surprises in our daily life (cf. GE 129 - 139).

Dear Sisters, can we overcome our fear, excessive caution and our tendency to be within safe bounds and reach out to the young people wounded and discouraged? Let us work with the enthusiasm of the "da mihi animas cetera tolle" and with boldness keep alive the Charism of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello in today's context.
