# My Dearest Sisters,

# Affectionate greetings to you from Kodambakkam!

We begin the month of August with deep sentiments of joy and gratitude to God and our blessed Mother for the innumerable graces showered on our institute, province and each of us. As *La Madre* and the Sisters of the Council have recorded in their last choral circular 1011, "Mary continues to walk with all of us as she did surprisingly in the life of our Founders and the history of the Institute, and helps us in our efforts so that we do not weaken the enthusiasm of fidelity." With her, we enter the third stage of the celebration of the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the foundation of the Institute on 5 August 2021 with our gaze ever directed forward. Our focus will be on *planning the future with audacity* and we want to do so encouraged by the example of Mother Mazzarello who tells us: "Courage... let us go forward with a big and generous heart" (L 47.12).

The Lord of the harvest has blessed our Province with the precious gift of vocations in Sri Lanka: Three postulants entering the Novitiate, seven novices making their first profession and one FMA consecrating herself to the Lord in perpetuity. We are grateful for the gift of the young people who continue to join our Institute and are being accompanied in the various stages of their formation with love and care.

## IN PREPARATION FOR THE CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS

As we are preparing for FMA India Centenary Celebrations we continue to "Journey with Mary in the Course of the Centenary (1922-2022) and Beyond", with the objective "Accept the mandate, I entrust them to you: Reviving the Family Spirit and Strengthening Community Communion". This month I invite you to reflect on the Family Spirit in the light of Don Bosco's exhortations on fraternal charity.

Article 50, of our Constitutions, states that "Family spirit is the creative outpouring of Don Bosco's heart, which must characterise all our communities and requires the commitment of everyone." Don Bosco lived family spirit as something that binds and bonds us together. The family spirit that

permeated the life of the Oratory in Valdocco is clearly expressed in the Biographical Memoirs: "At the Oratory, no one lived in fear but in peace and joy. Everyone breathed the air of a happy family. Don Bosco gave the young people every possible freedom as long as it posed no threat to anyone. This was the style which imbued every house established by Don Bosco including his religious community because his family spirit touched every aspect of the life and mission of the Salesians."

We are privileged to inherit the precious gift of this greatest treasure. In his Instruction and Exhortations to the FMA on the feast of the Immaculate Conception in 1984 Don Bosco indicates the importance of practising fraternal charity in strong terms. From his writings on fraternal charity, we can draw inspiration to nurture the family spirit among the Sisters in a simple way. The exercise of fraternal charity in the community becomes a great force that sustains and makes us tangible witnesses of the family spirit. Hence it is good for us to reflect on the exhortations of our Father and Founder Don Bosco to each of us as FMA and to examine our life together as a community in today's context.

Don Bosco states that "when fraternal love reigns in a community, all loving one another and each rejoicing in the good fortune of the other as if it were his [her] own, the house becomes a paradise..." This demands a large heart in relating with each other which is not stuck to petty things with a narrow vision. We are called to witness to the new way of living together not founded on ties of flesh and blood but the power of faith and sisterhood in Christ (Art. 36). Our founder adds: "Strive, therefore to avoid every word that in any way resembles destructive criticism, especially when directed against your companions, and even more so against your superiors. The worst type of destructive criticism is to give a bad interpretation to virtuous acts or to say that they have been performed with a bad intention." These words of Don Bosco remind me of one of the homilies of Pope Francis, in which he speaks about murmuring. He quotes the passage where the Pharisees and Scribes complain about Jesus saying: "He welcomes sinners, and eats with them." As the Pope points out complaining has become a part of our daily life. When we do not like something, we immediately murmur in a low voice and criticise it. Why do we lack the courage to confront the conflicting situation through sincere dialogue and open-minded discussion? Don't we need to be cautious not to blow off the fervour of the others with our destructive criticism?

Don Bosco further urges us: "... be gentle in your manner of speaking and dealing with others, not only with the superiors but also with all, and especially with those who in the past have offended you, or who in the present do not look kindly upon you." Today more than ever there is a great temptation to estrange ourselves from those who are not in line with our ideologies. There is a subtle indifference that clouds our communities and our interpersonal relationships leaving us shallow and cold. Contrary to this attitude of indifference gentleness and loving-kindness are the hallmarks of the Salesian spirituality. Don Bosco realized it from his nine-year-old dream in which he was asked to win over his friends not with blows but with gentleness and love.

Don Bosco also suggests to us: "To control anger which is so easily aroused in times of disagreement be careful not to say things that displease others or show arrogance." We need to be careful in the usage of words in our conversation especially in times of disagreement.

Nurturing family spirit does not imply that there will not be challenges in living together. Our Mother General Yvonne clearly states in one of her circular letters: "When I think of the family spirit I certainly do not intend a reality where there are no difficulties or hardships. I refer to communities in continuous construction where shadows and lights continually interweave until they become communion. 'This communion of life, rooted in faith, hope and charity, also becomes the response to the intimate needs of the human heart and disposes it for apostolic giving' (C 49)."

Being aware of our weaknesses and relying on the abundant grace of God let us strive hard to foster the family spirit promoted by Don Bosco in our communities thus breathing the genuine atmosphere of mutual trust and joy which will be passed on to our educating communities and favour the growth of Salesian vocations. In this way, we shall build the house of God's love in our communities.

Harkening to Don Bosco's invitation let us examine ourselves:

- ♣ Do we have the capacity to let die within ourselves any displeasing comments that we have heard from and about others?
- **How can we overcome our attitudes of indifference and negative criticism?**
- ♣ How can we live the fraternal charity in the community in our day to day life?

## FR STAN SWAMY SJ, A PROPHET OF OUR TIMES

We mourn the heroic death of Fr Stan Swamy (Fr Stanislaus Lourduswamy) SJ, who went to his eternal reward on 5 July 2021. He sacrificed his life for the cause of the Tribals in India, especially of Jharkhand. The 84-year-old Jesuit priest was in judicial custody charged under the anti-terror law, the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act 1967, as participating in a Maoist conspiracy to foment caste violence. The news of his death brought about by the various institutions that held him arbitrarily in custody for over 9 months has shaken not just the 'conscience' of India, but the entire world. I am sure, you participated in online homages organized to honour Fr Stan and some of you would have also had the privilege of paying him tribute and praying before his ashes. Fr. Stan Swamy was truly the champion and saviour of the underprivileged and the marginalized. His humble priestly life, committed ministry and identification with the least and the last in the society speak volumes about his holiness. Certainly, Fr. Stan is indeed a role model for all of us, and we hope that his martyr's death will bear much fruit over time. May his life be an inspiration to all of us and awaken our

dormant spirits to plunge into action for the welfare of the poor among us, become sensitive to the plight of the underprivileged, and be their powerful voice.
