Affectionate greetings to you from the Provincial House, Kodambakkam!

On the second day of February, we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which is observed as the World Day of Consecrated Life. Forty days after Christmas, we celebrate the Lord who enters the Temple and comes to encounter his people. In the Eastern Churches, this feast is called the "Feast of Encounter": it is the encounter between God, who became a child to bring newness to our world, and an expectant humanity, represented by the elderly man and woman in the Temple. I wish you a very happy day of Consecrated Life!

On the feast of Don Bosco, our Father and Founder, we had the joyful announcement of the **new Provincial** for our Province of St. Thomas, the Apostle (INM), **Sr Devadoss Margaret.** Our beloved Mother General Rev Sr Chiara Cazzuola has nominated her as the 16th Provincial of INM for the period of 2023 - 2029. We are indeed grateful to Mother and the members of the General Council for discerning the will of God for our Province.

Sr Margaret is serving our Province as a Provincial Councillor for the last six years and as the animator of the Formation house Sacred Heart Home, Katpadi for the past three years. She has a vast experience in the field of formation and animation and has contributed to the governance of the Province.

She made her first profession on 24 May 1988 at Sacred Heart Novitiate, Bangalore and her Final Commitment on 6 August 1994 at Auxilium College, Katpadi. She has obtained her Master's degree in Mathematics and Doctorate in Theology. She has done the Salesian Spirituality Course for two years in Rome and participated in the General Chapter XXIV at the Generalate, Rome in 2021. She has served the Province in various capacities: Assistant of the Candidates, Novices and Juniors, Animator of the formation house for four years and the community of Kingsford, Chennai for six years. She is a person of prayer, right judgement and creative thinking. She is dedicated to the mission and has a great sense of belonging to the Province, the Institute and the Church; as a theologian had contributed much to the spiritual growth of the Province as well as the Seminarians and formees of other congregations. The Visiting General Councillor Rev Sr Celine Jacob, will be installing the New Provincial on 25 May 2023. Hearty congratulations to you our dear Sr Devadoss Margaret the Provincial-Designate! We assure you of our loving prayers and sisterly support and collaboration.

We also rejoice and thank God for the gift of **Sr Fernando Majella**, the **Provincial Designate of Our Lady of Snow (INT)** Province. We express our heartiest congratulations and assurance of prayers to our dear Sister as she takes up the leadership of the young and vibrant Province for the next six years.

JOURNEY WITH MARY IN THE COURSE OF THE CENTURY AND BEYOND ...

We have just completed the first 100 YEARS of FMA Presence in India and 150 years of the foundation of our Institute. I invite you this month, to reflect on "Patience and Compassion as vital elements required for a synodal journey", drawing inspiration from the homily of Holy Father Pope Francis on World Day of Consecrated Life and his message for the World Day of the Sick 2023.

Pope Francis, during the homily on the feast of Presentation of our Lord on 2 February 2022, focused on the words of Simeon who "looked forward to the consolation of Israel" (Lk 2:25). Simeon and Anna awaited with patience the fidelity of the Lord and did not allow themselves to be robbed of the joy of the encounter with him. It is an invitation for all the consecrated women and men to look to the patience of God and the patience of Simeon as they consider their own lives of consecration. The Roman Pontiff says that Patience is a hallmark of consecrated women and men.

Patience is not simply about tolerating difficulties or showing grim determination in the face of hardship, it's not a sign of weakness, but the strength of spirit that enables us to 'carry the burden' of personal and community problems, to accept others as different from ourselves, to persevere in goodness when all seems lost, and to keep advancing even when overcome by fatigue and listlessness.

The Holy Father has pointed to what he called **three "settings"** in which patience can become concrete: In our **personal life** the way we have responded to the Lord's call has not always been constant because of disappointments, frustrations and feelings of powerlessness. In these circumstances, we have to be **patient with ourselves** and await in hope God's own times and places rather than yielding to interior sadness and discouragement.

A second setting in which patience can become concrete is **community life**. Human relationships are not always serene, especially when they involve sharing a project of life or apostolic activity. We need to cultivate a kind of reciprocal patience: "the ability to support, that is, to bear on our own shoulders, the life of one of our brothers or sisters, including his or her weaknesses and failings." The Roman Pontiff using an allegory beautifully exclaims, "Let us keep in mind that the Lord does not call us to be soloists, and there are many of those in the Church. We are called to be part of a choir that can sometimes miss a note or two, but must always try to sing in unison." Our Constitutions exhort, "Like the first community of Mornese, we are called to **live this patient charity that excuses all, trusts all, bears with all and never loses hope** (C 7).

The third setting described by Pope Francis concerns **our relationship with the world**. Simeon and Anna did not complain about how wrong things are but patiently looked for the light shining in the darkness of history. We too need that kind of patience, so as not to fall into the trap of lamenting that 'the world no longer listens to us', or 'we have no more vocations', 'it is very difficult to educate today's young people etc... Among the characteristics mentioned in the profile of the FMA as outlined by Don Bosco in the First Constitutions, it is stated, "Patient and zealous charity not only towards children but also towards young women and everyone without exception..."

This kindly patience helps us to be compassionate and merciful in the way we view ourselves, our communities and our world. This will enable us to accept every Sister in our community as she is, radiating the joy of fraternal life, and never to stop offering our service to all our brothers and sisters.

Our Holy Father has given us a beautiful message for the XXXI World Day of the sick observed on 11 February 2023, on the theme, "Take care of him" Compassion is a synodal exercise of healing. He says, "When we go on a journey with others, it is not unusual for someone to feel sick, to have to stop because of fatigue or of some mishap along the way. It is precisely in such moments that we see how we are walking together: whether we are truly companions on the journey, or merely

individuals on the same path, looking after our own interests and leaving others to "make do". For this reason, as the whole Church journeys along the synodal path, he invites all of us to reflect on the fact that it is especially through the experience of vulnerability and illness that we can learn to walk together according to the style of God, which is closeness, compassion, and tenderness. The World Day of the Sick calls for prayer and closeness towards those who suffer.

In his Encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*, Pope Francis encourages us to read anew the parable of the Good Samaritan, illustrating how we can move from the "dark clouds" of a closed world to "envisaging and engendering an open world" (cf. No. 56). There is a profound link between this parable of Jesus and the many ways in which fraternity is denied in today's world, leading to loneliness and abandonment. This kind of cruelty can be overcome more easily, as the parable tells us – to be **moved to compassion within us**. Two travellers, considered pious and religious, see the wounded man, yet fail to stop. The third passer-by, however, a Samaritan, a scorned foreigner, is moved with compassion and takes care of that stranger on the road, treating him as a brother. In doing so, without even thinking about it, **he makes a difference**, **he makes the world more fraternal**.

Let us reflect on the following questions and share our insights:
