My Dearest Sisters,

Affectionate greetings to you from the Provincial House, Kodambakkam!

We have begun the month of May *dedicated to Mary* our Blessed Mother. For us this month has an added significance as we celebrate *three Salesian saints*: the feast of St Dominic Savio on 06, our little Saint, the Birthday and Feast Day of our Mother and Co-foundress St Mary Domenica Mazzarello on 09 and 13 and the feast of our heavenly Mother, Mary Help of Christians on 24.

The devotion to Our Lady under the title 'Help of Christians' clearly exhibits her maternal presence in the events of humanity, of the Church, of the Congregation and each of us. JOURNEY WITH MARY IN THE COURSE OF THE CENTURY AND BEYOND ...

I invite you this month to reflect on the theme of **Love**, the greatest of the three theological virtues, as we continue the synodal journey in the course of the century and beyond.

Love, as St Paul reminds us, is the greatest of all of the Spirit's gifts because God is Love (1 Cor.13). When we are loved, we experience consolation and, when we love, we are ministers of Christ, the Consoler. This love has the power to overcome all hatred because it refuses to be drawn into the economy of enmity and the power struggles of dominance and subjection. Love seeks only the good of the other and it refuses to accept anything less. This gives to such love a strong, generous humility and a fierce commitment to the truth; freedom to speak and to act, to forgive and to reconcile; an audacity to gift another without looking for reward or recognition but only to delight the Holy Spirit who is Gift.

This way of loving tends not to draw attention to itself, yet we know it is present by the life that it produces and the fruit that it sustains. As it is taught in the school of God's own Triune Love, it will understand the beauty and the grace of diversity; that difference need not be a threat but is itself a gift when it comes to love. It will recognize the openness, reception and vulnerability of the other and claim responsibility for them, for their truth and the work that God has also called them to do. In this way, we can begin to discover how this gift of love gives us a new mission, not only with regard to each other but to build up the 'koinonia' – the fellowship – to which Christ calls us in His Church. This must be the experience lived in our communities too.

Pope Francis says that loving like Christ requires us to put aside other loves offered by the world, like the love of money, success, or power. These deceptive paths distance us from the Lord's love and lead us to become more and more selfish, narcissistic and overbearing. And being overbearing leads to a degeneration of love, to abuse others, to make our loved ones suffer. To love *as* Christ means to put oneself at the service of our brothers and sisters, as He did in washing the feet of the disciples. It means making ourselves available, as we are and with what we have. This means to love not in word but in deed. To love as the Lord loves us means to appreciate the people beside us and to respect their freedom, to love them as they are, gratuitously. It also means *overcoming the ambition to control others and instead giving ourselves to others*.

If we take these theological virtues faith, hope and love as our starting point, they can also help us with the process of discerning the path of the Holy Spirit that brings life to the community and its work. They are operative all through the criteria sketched in Lumen Gentium § 12 and we can see how they will also be active in the synodal process. An application of the theological virtues as part of the way in which we discern as well as act, can serve to guide us in our thinking and our relations. In this way, we may become a Church, a religious community, walking in consolation, even when members experience persecution, suffering and martyrdom.

By the same token, we can recognize those patterns and forces that bring desolation because they are opposed to faith, hope and love. Often well disguised, nevertheless, they will sow doubt and division, substituting ideology for a faith that humbly searches for an ever-deeper understanding of the mystery of salvation unfolding in history. Wherever we see the presence of suspicion, ready condemnation of the other who differs from us, and all the different mechanisms by which individuals and groups can be socially and spiritually assassinated,

repeating the ancient sin of Cain and Abel, or the constant jockeying for power and influence, the creation of circles of inclusion and exclusion and all the other strategies of control, then we know we are living in a community travelling in desolation, of unhappiness.

With the Spirit's gift of life in faith, hope and love comes the gift of responsibility to resist and overcome those patterns of fear and negativity which do not nourish the Mystical Body of Christ but continue to wound it. When we recognize these sources of desolation, we also recognize our need for healing and forgiveness, and this is the first step in the way of the Spirit.

Let us reflect on the following questions and share our insights:

- Am I capable of loving others and making myself available for the service of others?
- Do I consider the differences as resources for the fruitfulness of the mission?
- How can I live a life of faith, hope and love in my daily life?

REST IN PEACE IN HEAVEN DEAR SR. MARIADASS MARY PHILOMENA!

On Saturday, 29 April 2023, we were shocked and saddened by the sudden demise of one of the strong pillars that sustained the Chennai Province, our dear Sr Mariadass Mary Philomena. Through her deep faith and Eucharistic piety, foresight and meticulous planning, sensitivity and delicate dealing, spirit of sacrifice and hard work she had certainly contributed to the development of the Province and the communities in which she exercised the role of an animator, to grow in strength to strength. During these last days she was found weak and suffered shortness of breath but little did we imagine that she would pass away so soon. Sr Kunnathu Anna informed me on 28 April that she had breathing difficulty and immediate medical care was given and she became stable. I rushed to visit her on 29 April but Just before I could arrive there she had winged her way to heaven serenely surrounded by the Sisters of the community of Auxilium College, Katpadi, who lovingly accompanied her from May 2020.

Sr Mary Philomena was born in Mylapore, Madras on 13 July 1939, and professed at Katpadi on 05 August 1964. She was the second of five children, to profoundly Christian parents Mr. Susai Maria Dass and Mrs. Arputham Adaikalamary. She was baptized on 31 July in the same month of her birth and was brought up in deep faith being inculcated in Eucharistic Piety and Marian devotion at a tender age by her parents who lived an authentic Christian life. We are grateful to her parents from whom

she imbibed the qualities of kindness and firmness at the same time, living in the loving presence of Jesus always and a great devotion to our Blessed Mother. Sr. Philo Dass rendered a remarkable service for 59 long years in different communities exercising various roles - as assistant of the Candidates, Novices and Juniors, animator of the formation house Sacred Heart Home, of Auxilium College – Katpadi, Thanjavur and Dindigul, Provincial Economer, Vicar, Boarding Sister, Hostel Warden, In charge of linen, costumiere and Chronicles and she carried out all these roles with great perfection, precision and sense of belonging. The candidates and young Sisters for whom she was a formator experienced personally her motherly care and encouraging accompaniment in their vocational journey. As an animator, she showed special attention to the poor and the orphans, helped them to complete their higher education, took utmost care of them and thus reflected the providential and merciful face of God the Father to them.

We are grateful to her for having left behind a strong legacy of a life of fidelity to the Salesian vocation keeping Jesus as the focal point in her spiritual journey. She never compromised, but always upright, straight-forward, 'Yes for Yes and no for no.' She had such a strength of character that she was very courageous, daring and unrelenting in whatever was entrusted to her. She was a woman of few words but powerful in action. From her penetrating eyes, nothing escaped, she had a sharp wit combined with sisterly correction; majestic deportment and composure were her unique features.

Dear Sr. Philo, we thank you for your untiring work, commitment, and unassuming and selfless service to the Province, to the poor children, youth and women. We pray that the Lord grant you his eternal reward for your selfless service and may you receive the crown of glory. *Requiem in pacem!*
