A Daring Presence in the Journey of Transformation to Make a Meaningful Difference in the World Today

"There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love. We love because God first loved us." 1 Jn 4:18–19

Introduction

This month we shall reflect on "Daring Presence," which generates life (GCXXIV). Daring presence can mean different things to different people; simply put, daring presence comes from being authentic, building confidence in others, and inspiring others to take meaningful action. Daring presence, specifically, is a journey of personal transformation of who you are; the kind of person you are; and the kind of person you want to be. The significance of daring presence lies in daring to dare that propels us beyond our comfort zones, empowering us to reach heights that we once deemed impossible and unattainable. The quote, "I believe that the most important single thing beyond discipline and creativity is daring to dare," encapsulates the essence of what it takes to transcend limitations and achieve greatness in life.

Daring presence focuses on developing the characteristics, skills, and behaviours needed to exhibit reliability in all aspects of life. In the pursuit of the personal and community vision of our mission, we often find ourselves grappling with various aspects and dynamics that contribute to its successful accomplishment. Religious discipline, creative fidelity to the charism of our founders, diligent perseverance in responding to emerging socio-political challenges, and determined synodal journey with the young people are some of the commonly extolled essential attributes for realizing our objectives. The following traits can facilitate our daring presence to make a positive impact, inspire others to improve, and leave a lasting legacy wherever we are and whatever we do.

1. Courage as a Herald of Change

Courage as a herald of change is stepping beyond the boundaries of fear, familiarity, uncertainty, and insecurity. It does not imply the absence of fear; rather, it involves acknowledging fear's presence and choosing to move forward. Fear is a natural human response to the unknown, and often serves as an indicator of something significant lying ahead. By acknowledging fear and reframing it as an opportunity for courage, we can channel its energy into propelling us towards our aspirations rather than holding us back. We have to be willing to be bolder, louder, and all-around more visible.

Daring presence is also about confronting self-imposed limitations and embracing challenges with a spirit of fearlessness. Daring to dare is the catalyst that impels us toward innovation and exceptional accomplishments. It demands a readiness to embrace change and venture into the unknown, make bold decisions and embrace the possibility of failure, all in the pursuit of growth and self-discovery, collective commitment and communion. We cannot be complacent and small. By chasing our dreams, we can change our life path. Because there are people out there who need us, we need to be our authentic selves and be the noteworthy persons we are called to be.

2. Foster Resilience and Adaptability

Daring presence entails resilience and adaptability in the face of difficulties and challenges that may be part of the journey. However, these should not be perceived as a dead end but as a stepping stone toward growth. Embracing failure with a resilient spirit allows us to learn valuable lessons, refine our approaches, and continue moving forward with newfound vision and objectives, modalities and pathways, wisdom and determination. Our resilience, willpower, and knowledge will guide us to pursue paths of action that lead to success in all endeavours. Our premier task is to instil resilience and a winning spirit in everyone.

Resilience and adaptability are essential when accomplishing our common mission as a community. No matter what the challenges are, a strong personal commitment to the common mission and a positive attitude help prevail over any adverse internal and external conditions. We may experience situations where it would seem easier to quit rather than continue and finish the task. During those times, we need an inner source of energy to press on, to complete the mission. When things do not go as we wish, we must draw on our inner reserves to persevere and adapt to new challenges.

Resilient and adaptable people can recover quickly from setbacks, shocks, hurts, adversity and stress while maintaining the focus on the mission. Our resilience and adaptability rest on will, the inner drive that compels us to keep going, even when exhausted.

3. Break Free from Comfort Zones and Unleash Creativity

Daring presence requires breaking free from the comfort zone and embracing discomfort as a sign of growth. Comfort zones, while providing a sense of security and relaxation, can also prevent integral growth and limit our potential. Stepping outside our comfort zones stimulates our creativity as we are forced to think differently and find unique approaches to problems and challenges. It is through venturing into uncharted territories that we uncover hidden resources, strengths, talents, and capabilities that may have remained dormant within us.

The fusion of daring and creativity thrusts us to journey onward, achieving breakthroughs that were once believed unreachable. A daring presence could act as a catalyst for channelling various personal and community qualities and values into revolutionary ideas, innovative initiatives, and well-defined activities. The world doesn't need another carbon copy of someone else. We can give so much to the world just by being who we are and what we are capable of accomplishing. We don't need a mask or a disguise to make people know who we are so that they can be who they are.

4. Seize Opportunities and Embrace Growth

A daring presence opens doors to countless opportunities that would otherwise remain concealed. It drives us toward seizing opportunities that align with our aspirations and values, accelerating personal and community well-being. It requires developing competencies and investing in oneself to empower and expand one's potential. Each time we dare to step into the unknown, we build upon our experiences and talents, urging ourselves further along the path of self-improvement and success, satisfaction, and societal well-being.

Great leaders exhibit humble confidence and credibility, authentic trust and consistency in lifting others. Daring presence also develops leadership in individuals by empowering them to better understand themselves, specifically how to manage themselves and their responses effectively. It influences leadership strategies impacting the personal journey and building the capacity to seek opportunity and stand out among leaders. There is a great deal of self-reflection while building others in a fulfilling way and making a lasting and positive impression on others. Change and a growth mindset happen when we seek to learn, invest in our leadership journey, and open ourselves up to becoming a better version of ourselves.

5. Inspire and Empower Others

Daring presence is not something we are born with but an essential attribute, something we can learn all through our lives. It is not just a matter of showing up; it requires projecting an image. We can exhibit our daring presence through credible actions, words, and how we carry ourselves. Daring presence is not a solitary endeavour. When we lead by example and dare to embrace our aspirations courageously, we inspire others to do the same. This cascading effect creates a culture of fearlessness and empowerment within communities and workplaces.

Daring presence is an investment in one's current and future selves; it is the gift that keeps on giving. When we are present, confident, reflective, and lead with authenticity, our presence becomes a daring presence and empowers others. We need to develop a sense of presence that will inspire people to trust and follow us. We need to ensure that we evolve and develop our own authentic and daring presence to open new doors, new visions, and new lifestyles.

Conclusion

In a world that constantly evolves, our presence, as daring to dare, enhances individuals beyond their limitations, igniting a spark of courage that fuels innovation and growth. Let us embrace the spirit of daring to dare so that we discover the full extent of our capabilities and leave an indelible mark on the world around us. It's often the 'I dare moments' that push us beyond where comfort could keep us and the familiar world would fence us in. Let God's Word-the record of those who went before us, those whom God used to forge the future through acts that were not for the fainthearted-motivate us. The biblical accounts: Moses before Pharaoh; Daniel in the lions' den; the disciples leaving behind all they knew to follow a man called Jesus they had only just met, invite us for a willingness to dare to go beyond the usual to fulfil the plan of God.

Our present faith was shaped by those who dared in the past: our pioneers, missionaries, and the Sisters of our land. Now it is our turn to dare to go farther and shape the future. Perhaps it's time we all get back to the place of daring, a journey that awaits those who, with courage and willingness, take the first steps on an uncharted path. The more we see the God who works for us and in us and through us, the more we will know His steadfast love.

Where challenges and difficulties have closed the doors, we need the daring presence to open our lives to possibilities once more. Where we have held back because of uncertainty, we need to venture out, trust, and step out. Where we have stopped daring because we don't want to face resistance, we need to allow the daring presence to deepen our learning and understanding. The very thing we are seeking could be on the other side of our daring lives.

Let us realize that the leap we most decline may just be the leap we most need today.

PEACE MESSAGE 2024: Artificial Intelligence and Peace

Pope Francis's message for the 57 World Day of Peace, emphasizes the positive contributions of science and technology to human progress while cautioning against the potential risks posed by advances in artificial intelligence (AI). He discusses the ethical dimensions of AI, including concerns related to privacy, bias, and the impact on human dignity. The message stresses the need for responsible development, regulation, and oversight of AI technologies, highlighting potential risks in areas such as disinformation, social control, military, education, the workforce and international law. The Pope calls for cross-disciplinary dialogue, the ethical development of algorithms (algo-ethics), and the inclusion of diverse voices in decision-making processes. By reminding us that the measure of true humanity lies in how we treat the least among us, he concludes with a hopeful vision that AI development may contribute to human fraternity and world peace: "For peace is the fruit of relationships that recognise and welcome others in their inalienable dignity and of sincere cooperation and commitment in seeking the integral development of all individuals and peoples".

STRENNA 2024: "The dream that makes you dream." A heart that transforms "wolves" into "lambs".

The Rector Major Fr Ángel Fernández Artime, invites the Salesian Family to "take advantage of this bicentenary year of the dream to study and deepen the Memoirs of the Oratory and the dream at nine years." He does so with profound conviction, aware that "in this area of Salesianity, of our history, and of the foundations of our charism, we run the risk of concentrating and always stopping only on some very simplified commonplaces, and of repeating a few generic statements." Thus, he expresses the need to offer a more consistent reflection "on the Salesian Family in the world, lay people, young people, boys and girls".

The Rector Major ends his Strenna by emphasizing the importance of others "to build ourselves and our dream" and the need to trust and entrust ourselves, confidently handing ourselves over to the guidance of Mary, who in the dream is defined as "the Teacher". "This of course presupposes that there are wise and evangelically inspired leaders on whom we can rely. In this too we have been entrusted with a wonderful task".

I urge all of you to read and reflect on the Strenna, individually and as a community, to live it in our daily lives.

UNO Theme: International Year of Camelids (IYC) 2024

The UN has designated 2024 as the International Year of Camelids. Camels are an important source of livelihood for millions of families around the world. The Year is meant to raise the public's and policymakers' awareness of the significant role of camelids in protecting ecosystems, conserving biodiversity, assuring food security and adapting to climate change. The optimization of the many qualities of camelids (meat, milk, fibre, means of transport) would also contribute to guaranteeing food security and nutrition, providing sustainable livelihoods and promoting the inclusion of communities that benefit from these animals. Camelids can help promote the sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems (SDG 15) and, therefore, combat desertification, and land degradation and stem the loss of biological diversity. The integrated management of camelid products will promote community inclusivity and help to create sustainable employment as well as promote equality.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

OCTAVE OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY (18-25 Jan. 2024)

"Restoration of unity among Christians is one of the main concerns of the Church... and this task is for all of us. No one can claim exemption from this responsibility. Indeed, everybody can make some contribution, however small it may seem, and all are called to that interior conversion which is the essential condition for ecumenism." Pope St John Paul II, 30 May 1982.

This Octave was first conceived by Father Paul of Graymoor on 30 November 1907. It was given papal blessings by Pope St Pius X on 27 December 1909. Other popes have given it their blessings over the years, including Pope St John XXIII (who urged its observance more widely throughout the world) and Pope St Paul VI (who had promoted it in his archdiocese when he was the Cardinal Archbishop of Milan).

The Octave reflects the unchanging truth that there can be no real unity apart from union with that Rock, established by Christ Himself, which is Peter and his successors. For that reason, St Peter is considered the special Patron of the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity.

I urge you, dear Sisters, to pray for Christian Unity and make our young people do the same.

Celebrated on 26 January every year, Republic Day holds immense significance in the hearts of every Indian. It is a day to honour the spirit of India, its unity, diversity and democratic values. January is special for the Salesian Family because, we celebrate the feasts of three great giants of holiness: St Francis De Sales, St John Bosco and Bl. Laura Vicuna.

On 22 January we celebrate the feast of **Bl. Laura Vicuna**, a pupil of Maria Auxiliadora in Junin de los Andes from 1900 to 1904, attained sanctity at a tender age. She spent more time praying in the chapel and was very kind and patient to her companions. Laura interiorized the words of Jesus, "No one has greater love than to give up one's life for one's friends,".

Laura then decided to give her life in exchange for her mother's salvation. She stands as a great model of evangelical courage, sacrifice and genuine love for the young people today. We the educators of young people are invited to inculcate in them a thirst for God and love for sacrifice and make them God-loving persons and honest citizens.

On 24 January we celebrate the feast of **St Francis De Sales**, the patron of our Institute. St Francis De Sales, the holy Bishop of Geneva, became the inspirer of Salesian spirituality and a model shepherd whom Don Bosco looked up to from the very beginning of his work, for his ability to make himself lovable, for his intense apostolic activity, and the desire that everyone would know and meet the God of mercy and forgiveness. Don Bosco chose him as Patron and model of life from his priestly Ordination because the mission to the young required great calm and gentleness - "A drop of honey catches more flies than a gallon of gall."


