# ALL IN THE FAMILY

Million Thanks to our dear Sr Nilza Fátima de Moraes, General Councillor for Formation and Sr Anelfreda Miranda, Sector Collaborator who visited the Province from 24 September to 8 October 2024. From 26 to 30 September, Sr Nilza and Sr Anelfreda, met the Aspirants, Postulants, Temporary Professed Sisters, and Community Animators of Sri Lanka.

On 26 and 27 September 2024, sixteen young Sisters had the joy of meeting them at Sacred Heart Novitiate, Negombo. They warmly welcomed Sr Nilza and Sr Anelfreda with the guard of honour. Sr Nilza shared a message from Mother General, emphasizing the importance of "planting seeds for the future." The next day, the Eucharistic Celebration was presided over by Fr Roger Pinto, who spoke about the significance of a deep relationship with Jesus and the different types of martyrdom. Sr Nilza and Sr Anelfreda led reflections on the wedding at Cana, encouraging personal sharing and discussion among the Sisters. The visit concluded with a cultural programme and gifts to express their gratitude. On 27 September, the Holy Mass was celebrated by Fr Danushka Silva, his homily focusing on personal growth and the active pursuit of character development. The Sisters were engaged in Lectio Divina and discussions about the role of community animators.

The animators of the nine communities gathered in Omanthai on 28 September for presentations and group sharing, culminating in expressions of gratitude for the guidance provided by Sr Nilza and Sr Anelfreda. They visited various communities, including the apostolic school and Salesian Philosophy students, where they were warmly welcomed and had meaningful interactions. The visit concluded a trip to the National Shrine of Our Lady of Lanka, leaving Sr Nilza with a heart full of joy and contentment.

The same day they visited the Eppawala community and were warmly welcomed with a joyful welcome song by the community and preschool children. The Sisters shared a meal, exchanging news about their beautiful surroundings, including the chirping of birds. Sr Nilza's simplicity and cheerful demeanour reinforced the joy of belonging to the FMA Institute. She expressed her heartfelt gratitude for the warm welcome, encouraging the community to continue their mission filled with the spirit of Mornese, and invoked the protection of Mary, the Mother of their vocation.

On 1 October 2024, Sr Kunnathu Anna and I extended a warm welcome to dear Sr Nilza and Sr Anelfreda at Chennai airport. On Arrival at Kodambakkam, Sr Anthony Raj Christina and the Fatima community greeted them with traditional garlands and Oyilattam celebrating the visit with songs of appreciation and expressions of hope. Sr Nilza conveyed warm wishes from the Mother General and shared a peace-themed goodnight message, leaving everyone with a sense of gratitude.

On 8 October Sr Nilza had the joy of meeting the students, teachers, parents, past pupils and the members of the Educating Community of Fatima Matriculation Higher Secondary School. The Bharatha Natiyam dance following the welcome song depicted the richness of South India. Sr Nilza exhorted the students to benefit from Salesian education and to become good Christians and honest citizens. She visited the Shrines of St. Thomas Mount, Little Mount, Adyar Veilanganni, and Santhome Cathedral. She met the Salesians at St. Bede's. From there they proceeded to Our Lady's Centre, Kingsford and addressed the school students and the community. She had the joy of meeting the Salesian Provincial Fr. Lourdusamy Don Bosco and the Salesians at Citadel.

From 2 to 3 October, Sr Nilza and Sr Anelfreda, met the Aspirants and Postulants, formators and the community Sisters at Sacred Heart Home, Katpadi. On 4 October, she went to Auxilium Home and met the apostolic school students, formators and the community Sisters. She also addressed the staff of Auxilium Schools. At St Mary's Convent, Vellore, Sr Nilza led a conference on the significance of Mary Help of Christians and St Mary Mazzarello, encouraging the Sisters' commitment to their charism. She met more than 100 teaching staff, commending their role as educators and stressing the importance of nurturing life through the Gospel. She visited the Cathedral Church and greeted the Apostolic Administrator Fr. I. John Robert, leaving a lasting impact on everyone.
